

Global Facilitator Trainings in Full Swing Online and In-Person





Over 60 trainees are engaged in the GERI online and in-person Facilitator Training Modules, which are running concurrently. A new global group of 30 began their online training this spring, with trainees from Australia, Canada, Kenya, Mexico, South Africa, South Korea, and the United States. The South African cohort of 33 trainees continued their in-person training in Module 2 & 3 this year in March and June.

Nearly 60 leaders from over 20 countries - representing women's & men's organizations, foundations, NGOs, and other initiatives focusing on gender equality - attended a special invitational session at the U.N. NGO CSW.

"I came in as a stranger with little knowledge of GERI and the surrounding community, but they brought me in completely. I feel heard, understood, and respected. My fellow




participants taught me so much through sharing their stories and thoughts with me and the rest of the group."

Growing Latin American GERI

Latin American GERI was launched in autumn 2020 through the dedicated leadership of Silvia Araya-Villalobos and the facilitation team: Jorge Rico, Alejandra Warden, Hugo Sanchez, Natalia Cediel, Jaime Valdes, and Kritin Lietz.



The team has hosted four full GERI online courses, which have been beautifully received. Participants have shared and connected around diverse (and common) experiences and stories - from living with harassment in public places, to the need to hide their strength and

intelligence in professional settings, to the challenges of being raised in a culture of *machismo*, or of fathers unable to see their children. Without fail, this sharing and truth-telling begins to open into deeper connection and appreciation. As one woman reflected, "I love being part of GERI because I was listened to, and I listened. I felt confident in opening my heart, and others trusted me to tell their experiences, which I treasure in my heart this and it fills me with gratitude..."

All the workshops are conducted in Spanish, and Silvia dedicated intensive efforts to the translation of GERI materials into Spanish.

Religious Chaplaincy and Civil Society Workshop - Paarl, South Africa

April 19 - 21

What a joy to welcome into GERI this group of 34 leaders from the Boland rural region outside Cape Town. Religious ministers, government officials, and NGO leaders joined for three days



of deep sharing, heartfelt listening, and inspired honoring of one another's stories.

As one woman reflected afterwards, "The course changed my life in an amazing way. It enabled me to share my inner most intimate truths in a safe space with people who had their own inner truths and experiences too. It was practical and seemed easy, but was deep.

A true experience that helped me start the journey to my own healing. I was humbled by the reaction of men to my truths; it was not defensive, but allowed me to share, and to feel that I am acknowledged. This was a first experience but it surely made an impact.

South Africa needs this kind of training. We need to heal as families, communities and the country."
